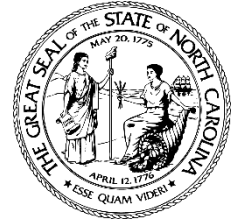

Local Bills	Monday, April 15	Tuesday, May 7

Eligible to file in 2024 Short Session (no deadline)

- Bills amending the North Carolina Constitution, to implement proposed amendments, or both
- Appointments to/confirmation of members of State Boards/commissions either by the Governor, the General Assembly, or one or more chambers
- Resolutions not prohibited by Senate Rules
- Joint resolutions authorizing other bills and those bills if resolution passes by two-thirds vote in each chamber
- Bills relating to election laws, including redistricting
- Bills responding to litigation related to redistricting bills for elected State, federal, or local office or the legality of legislative enactments
- Bills providing for impeachment of State officers
- Bills to disapprove Administrative Rules
- Adjournment resolutions and amendments to adjournment resolutions
