UPDATED -- The Finance Subcommittee on Annexation/Deannexation will meet Thursday, June 6, 2024, at 8:45 a.m. in Room 643 of the Legislative Office Building, to discuss HB 918 - Mount Gilead Annex/Kannapolis Deannex and HB 931 - Town of Newport/Deannexation. (Chair anticipates to be added.)

Eligible to file in 2024 Short Session but no deadlines:

- (1) Bills amending the North Carolina Constitution, to implement proposed amendments, or both.
- (2) Appointments to/confirmation of members of State Boards/commissions either by the Governor, the General Assembly, or one or more chambers.
- (3) Resolutions not prohibited by House Rules.
- (4) Joint resolutions authorizing other bills and those bills if resolution passes by two-thirds vote in each chamber.
- (5) Bills relating to election laws, including redistricting.
- (6) Bills responding to litigation related to redistricting bills for elected State, federal, or local office or the legality of legislative enactments.
- (7) Bills providing for impeachment of State officers.
- (8) Bills to disapprove Administrative Rules.
- (9) Adjournment resolutions and amendments to adjournment resolutions.

Otherwise eligible for consideration

- (1) Bills that made cross-over and bills that did not make, but are not subject to, cross-over.
- (2) Veto overrides.
