## **Crossover Deadline: Thursday, May 8**

#### Bills eligible to be filed in 2025 with no deadlines:

- (1) Redistricting bills for House, Senate, Congress, or local entities.
- (2) Ratification of amendments to the Constitution of the United States.
- (3) Bills providing for action on gubernatorial nominations or appointments.
- (4) Appointments by the General Assembly.
- (5) Adjournment resolutions.
- (6) Bills introduced on the report of the House Committees on Appropriations, Finance, or Rules.
