Eligible to file in 2026 Short Session with no deadlines:

- (1) Bills to amend the North Carolina Constitution, to implement proposed amendments to the North Carolina Constitution, or both.
- (2) Appointments by one or both chambers of the General Assembly.
- (3) Bills providing for action on gubernatorial nominations or appointments.
- (4) Joint resolutions authorizing other bills and the bills authorized if the resolution passes by two-thirds vote in each chamber.
- (5) Resolutions not prohibited by House Rules.
- (6) Bills responding to litigation related to the legality of legislative enactments.
- (7) Bills relating to election laws, including redistricting.
- (8) Bills to disapprove Administrative Rules.
- (9) Bills providing for impeachment of State officers.
- (10) Adjournment resolutions and amendments to adjournment resolutions.

Otherwise eligible for consideration:

- (1) Bills that made cross-over and bills not subject to cross-over.
- (2) Veto overrides.
